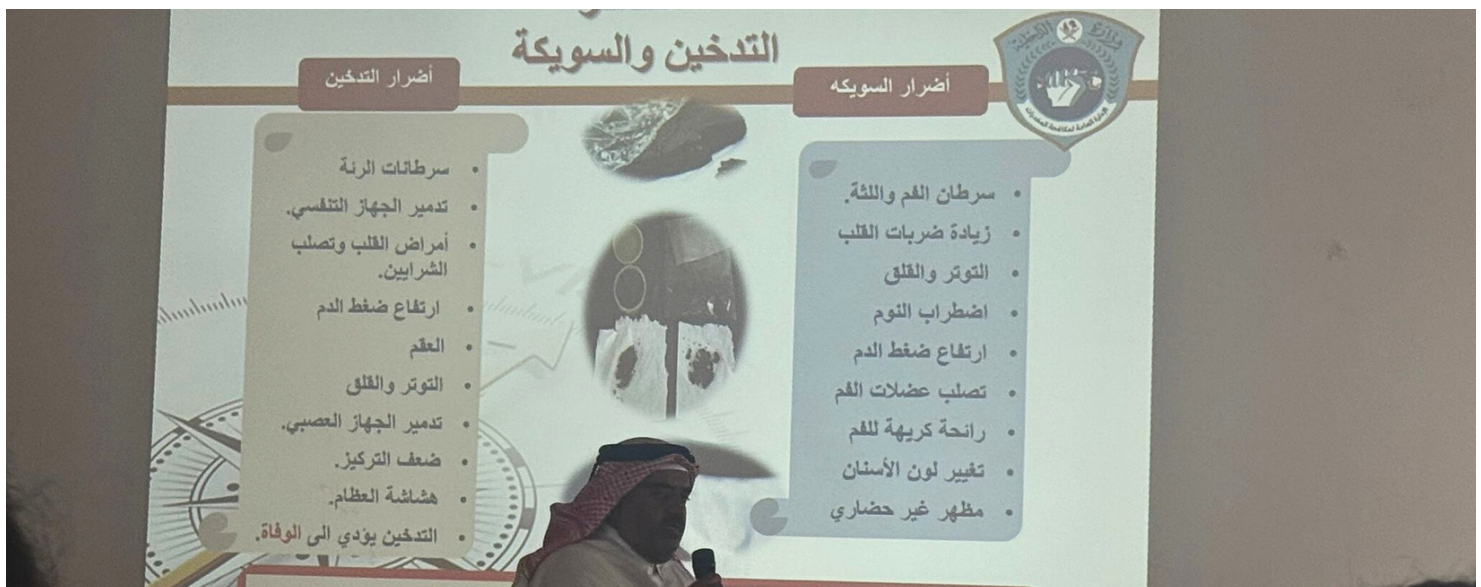
UDST Visit
